Many of us do not need to do much planning to fully engage in these types of activities. But for a person with a mobility issue, finding accessible seating can often pose a challenge.

Emergency Equipment Repairs—Helping People and Families with Unexpected Costs

The people and families who receive supports and services through Monadnock Developmental Services often rely on a variety of adaptive equipment to help them with daily activities. Even with routine maintenance, unexpected equipment failures can still happen. This can create a wide range of problems and barriers for the people and their families who rely on the equipment. A person's mobility can be greatly reduced and their ability to communicate compromised. This in turn affects their families and care providers, causing increased physical demands and stress.

Recently, a person we support and his family experienced the sudden malfunction of their stair lift. This adult man has sustained a traumatic brain injury and lives with his parents in their two-story family home. The man's bedroom and bathroom are on the second floor, and he requires a stair lift to access both these rooms. Without funding to repair the stair lift, his parents would have to carry him up and down the
