Unauthorized Restraint/ Seclusion Definition- Any unapproved physical, chemical or mechanical intervention that is used to control acute, episodic behavior that restricts the movement or function of the individual or a portion of the individual's body, or the involuntary confinement of an individual alone in a room or an area from which the individual is physically prevented from having contact with others and/ or leaving (e.g. physical intervention occurred, door locked, mechanical device/ barrier). Chemical interventions are reported only on unauthorized administration or emergency use by medical practitioner, not PRN's authorized in bx plan or for anxiety.

Examples of unauthorized restraints- Physically stopping an individual from running out into the road, when they don't have an approved bx plan or when staff isn't restraint trained. Physically stopping an individual from hitting themselves or others with their fist or object, when they don't have an approved bx plan or when staff isn't restraint trained. Physically stopping the individual from eating raw chicken, when they don't have an approved bx plan or when staff isn't restraint trained.

Examples to unauthorized seclusion: Physically blocking an individual from leaving their bedroom or their house/ a building, when they don't have an approved bx plan.
