Warm Winter Clothing

Over the past several years, we have been able to provide warm winter coats, boots and other items for over a dozen individuals who would otherwise do without. Medicaid doesn't cover clothing expenses, so when winter comes, we can be sure everyone stays warm and dry.



Van Modification

A teenager with a spinal disorder uses a wheelchair. To get him to appointments, school and for community outings, the parents need to buy a larger van and then have it modified to fit his wheelchair. The modifications cost as much as the van, but will serve the family for a long time. Medicaid only pays for the cost of the modifications.

Power Lift Recliner

An individual was using an old recliner as their primary piece of furniture. They spent most of their day sitting on it, and slept in it at night. The recliner was falling apart and becoming unusable. The seating back was starting to separate from the frame. Additionally, the individual was aging with limited mobility, which limits the options of appropriate seating. The new recliner allowed them to be more independent and comfortable in their daily life, be cleaner and easier to maintain, and help prevent back injury and discomfort during the duration of use.
