Funding Challenges Grow

In recent years, Area Agencies have experienced a decline in flexible funding to provide support to individuals with developmental disabilities. Area Agencies are critical in providing essential services, including employment support, community integration, and safeguards to individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). However, budget constraints have resulted in leaving many agencies struggling to meet the increasing demand for services and other unfunded needs.

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Fiscal challenges, including reduced revenue, increased needs and rising healthcare costs, have placed a strain on the availability of resources for individuals with IDD. Area agencies, which rely heavily on Medicaid funding, have struggled with staffing shortages which has resulted in a limited capacity to offer comprehensive care. As a result, individuals with developmental disabilities face longer wait times for services, reduced hours of services, and less access to critical programs.

Medicaid rates have made it difficult for agencies to recruit and retain qualified staff. With the increased demand for services and the added pressure of fewer financial resources, many agencies are unable to offer competitive wages or benefits to attract skilled professionals. This has led to high turnover rates and burnout among existing staff, further exacerbating the challenges faced by individuals with developmental disabilities.

These reductions in funding not only impact the agencies and their employees but also directly affect the individuals they serve. People with developmental disabilities and their families often face emotional, physical, and financial stress as they try to navigate a system that is under-resourced.

Adults with Developmental Disabilities and the Importance of the MDS Dental Fund

In 2023, after years of advocacy, NH expanded Medicaid dental benefits to include preventive and restorative dental care for adults. While this has allowed some adults on Medicaid to access dental care, provider availability remains a significant hurdle.

One major challenge is the shortage of dentists who accept Medicaid. Low reimbursement rates and administrative hurdles discourage providers from participating in the program. This results in long wait times, and difficulty finding a qualified dentist, particularly one trained to accommodate the unique needs of patients with developmental disabilities.

Additionally, many individuals with developmental disabilities require specialized care, such as sedation or behavioral supports, to undergo dental procedures. Medicaid often does not fully cover these additional services, making it even harder for patients to receive the care they need. Families and caregivers may struggle to find providers willing and able to treat individuals with complex medical or behavioral conditions.

Advocates continue to push for improved reimbursement rates, expanded provider participation, and better accommodations to ensure that adults with developmental disabilities are able to receive the dental care they need for overall health and well-being.

The MDS Development Committee is tasked with major fundraising efforts to help address unmet dental needs not covered by Medicaid. Funding primarily comes from the annual Run~Walk~Smile road race, as well as individual, community and corporate donations. The generous support of our donors has been crucial to providing critical dental care to the adults that we serve. Through your support, hundreds of individuals have received the dental care they so desperately need.

At Monadnock Developmental Services, our mission is to work toward inclusion, participation, and mutual relationships for all people who are at risk of isolation from community.

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How MDS Puts Your Donations To Work For Unmet Needs

Clothing

Over the past several years, we have provided clothing for more than a dozen individuals who would otherwise go without.

Medicaid doesn't cover clothing expenses.

iPad

A middle-aged woman with cerebral palsy and spinal bifida used a very old tablet that consistently froze on her. This limited her ability to email and face time with longtime friends. An new iPad would improve the clients life and ability to connect with the greater community. Medicaid doesn't pay for personal devices like I Pads.

Speech Generating Device

A child with cerebral palsy, blindness, seizure disorder and a g-tube feed had been using a Talk 9 Speech Generating Device that was a short term rental from their school. She is non-verbal and had been using the device to effectively communicate their wants and needs. This device had offered this child a "voice" which allowed them to engage in social interactions and offered the ability to control and direct communication in their environment. This type of device is not covered under Medicaid.
